Sarcoma Awareness Month 2017



With Sarcoma Awareness Month 2017 drawing to a close in just a few short hours, it only seems appropriate to take a moment to revisit a few of the ways that you have helped us to increase awareness this July.

Race to Cure Sarcoma™ Virtual Race

With just hours left to go, the first-ever Race to Cure Sarcoma[™] Virtual Race has already raised more than \$16,000 for sarcoma research. The goal was to cover 2,789 miles from coast to coast, representing the distance to run from the Sarcoma Foundation of America's

Maryland headquarters to San Francisco. Participants from 32 states, along with with runners/walkers from Mexico, France, and England, have collectively run more than 3,000 miles since the beginning of the month. Wow! Kudos to all these dedicated athletes!!




Winners Announced for SFA's 2017 Children's Art Contest
