Over the past few weeks we've seen the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) make decisions regarding some investigational therapies for sarcoma. In that time, one investigational new drug received priority review status, which cuts the drug review period from 10 months to six months. Another was given fast track designation. This designation is also intended to

expedited the review process for "serious conditions with unmet medical need." Certainly sarcoma falls into that category.

NCI Announces Pediatric Sarcoma Grant Opportunity

The National Cancer Institute has announced a research project grant on gene fusions in pediatric sarcomas. According to the funding opportunity announcement, the NCI is looking for projects that create a "better understanding of the molecular pathways activated by chromosomal translocations in pediatric sarcomas," that

could "potentially lead to novel therapeutics."

The Sarcoma Foundation was honored to be invited to participate in conference call with Vice President Joe Biden on the work being done as a part of the Cancer Moonshot initiative. During the call, he announced that a Cancer Moonshot Summit will be held in Washington, DC, on June 29, 2016. He also encouraged patients and



advocates to share their ideas and thoughts about what should be included in the Moonshot effort.

These ideas will be considered by the working groups and the Blue Ribbon panel that have been appointed to help guide this process. They will be meeting and working to discuss research priorities over the next few months.
