Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

Last month, the childhood cancer community came together to honor Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. During September, the SFA took part in several events designed to bring more attention to the needs of childhood cancer patients and survivors.

The SFA was there as the Childhood

Cancer Research Landscape
Report, a comprehensive report on
the state of research and treatment
for childhood cancer, was unveiled on
Capitol Hill. This report was a product
of the Alliance for Childhood Cancer,
of which the SFA is a member, and
the American Cancer Society.

- Once again, the SFA was honored to represent the childhood sarcoma community at a White House briefing on Childhood Cancer.
- The SFA took part in the 6th Annual Childhood Cancer Summit hosted by the <u>Congressional Childhood Cancer</u> Caucus.
- In an effort to raise more awareness, the SFA was a featured guest for a childhood cancer Twitter Chat hosted by the National Organization for Rare Disorders. During the chat, the SFA fielded questions, shared resources, and urged for the support of the <u>Childhood Cancer STAR Act</u>.

While the calendar has turned and Childhood Sarcoma Awareness month has come to an end, our attention to childhood cancer has not. The SFA remains dedicated as ever to serve as a voice for the children and adolescents who are affected by sarcoma and pledge to build off of the efforts and momentum created in September.
