This year SFA was privileged to honor Dr. William Tap and Robin Rawlins-Duell, ANP-BC both from Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center with these prestigious awards. SFA also presented Stryker with the Vision of Hope Award, in recognition of their efforts to advance the care and treatment of sarcoma, bringing hope to patients and survivors.

The first year the team participated in the Race to Cure Sarcoma Chicago event, they had 113 members and raised over \$164,000.
